Her children had been taken away from her, she had lost all self respect, and felt as thought she had truly hit "her bottom".

Tonya worked the program diligently by attending meetings, participating in the AA/NA community functions, working the 12 steps with her sponsor, and following all of our suggestions. As she grew in recovery, so did her spirits and her faith in God. Tonya suffered many disappointments regarding her visitation with her children. She would be so excited to see her children, and time after time the children were not there as the custodial parents refused to show up. I personally admired her strength in practicing the 12 steps and not giving in to these disappointments. She handled it with grace and proved to be a wonderful role model for the other



residents. Her graduation ceremony was very tearful as each resident expressed to Tonya how much she meant to them. Her mother wrote a beautiful poem to Tonya expressing her love and support.

Tonya continues to call me and is doing great. Her visitations are finally consistent and she is looking forward to hopefully regaining custody in the near future. She is a true inspiration for all women in recovery and especially to the other mothers. Tonya set a goal and utilized the recovery process to reach it.

God bless you Tonya and we are very proud of all you have and continue to accomplish.
